Along this path we will find vegetation typical of the Guadalquivir basin, although with a marked character of the northern countryside of Jaén.

The presence of water in the Guadalquivir River throughout the year boosted the development of plentiful riverside vegetation, of vital importance for biodiversity.

The thick riverside vegetation also serves as a refuge for fauna. A multitude of birds nest inside the trunk of an old black poplar. Mammals with normally nocturnal and twilight habits spend most of the day hidden among the vegetation.

The riverside forest also has the function of damping temperatures down and regulating the local microclimate. It has even been found that the riverside trees act as windbreaks, thus having a beneficial effect on adjacent crops.
